The following notification of the Government of India, Ministry of Law and Justice (Legislative Department), New Delhi-110 001, dated 29th March, 2014 [8 Chaitra, 1936 (Saka)] is republished:—

S.O. (E).—Whereas it has been decided to hold a general election for the purpose of constituting a new House of the People, on the expiration of the term of fifteenth House of the People:—

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the provisions contained in sub-section (2) of Section 14 of the Representation of the People Act, 1951 (43 of 1951), the President is pleased to call upon the Parliamentary constituencies, specified, in column (2) of the Table given below comprised within the corresponding States or Union territories, as the case may be, of Assam, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Jammu & Kashmir, Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu, Uttar Pradesh, West Bengal and Puducherry, as specified in column (1) of the said Table, to elect members in accordance with the provisions of the said Act and of the rules and orders made thereunder:
