MOTOR VEHICLES - Economy in expenditure on Departmental Vehicles - Recommendations of the Committee on Motor Vehicles - Ceiling on fuel consumption - Continuance of fuel ceiling scheme for 2010-2011- Orders - Issued.

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ORDER:

The Government emphasize the need for utmost economy in expenditure on Motor Vehicles as outlined in the Government Order first read above. Continuance of the fuel ceiling scheme for the year 2003-2004 for the departmental vehicles was ordered in the Government Order Eleventh read above and it was also indicated therein that the ceiling for consumption of fuel has to be observed strictly curtailing unnecessary trips.

2. In the G.O.19th cited, Government have fixed the fuel ceiling for Departments of Secretariat / Head of Departments concerned for the year 2009-2010 as was fixed in the G.O.18th read above. Departments of Secretariat / Head of Departments concerned were requested not to utilize the fuel allotted for vehicles condemned on or after 1-04-2009 onwards.

3. In the Government letter 20th read above, Government have issued authorization regarding to admit the fuel claim bills **upto September 2010** as per the fuel ceiling fixed for **2009-2010**.

4. In the context of the need to conserve fuel and the necessity to observe austerity measures, the Government, after careful examination, have decided to fix the total operational **ceiling for the year 2010-2011** on the basis of total number of motor vehicles furnished by the Departments. The changes reported by certain Heads of Departments during 2009-2010 have been adjusted in the operational ceiling for 2010-2011. The Government accordingly direct that the total operational ceiling of fuel (inclusive of "Normal" and "Reserve" Quota) be fixed in respect of the motor vehicles in the various departments as indicated in columns (7) and (8) of the Annexure-I of this order for the year 2010-2011 i.e., from 1st April 2010 to 31st March 2011. Departments of Secretariat / Heads of Departments are requested to apportion the quantum of fuel fixed in the Annexure-I for the individual vehicle sanctioned to their department depending upon the need and usage of the motor vehicles in accordance with the norms indicated in the Annexure-II and III to this order.

5. Reserve Quota is created by keeping 5 percent of the ceiling arrived at and Heads of Departments should take special care that during special drives and emergency situations alone the utilization of fuel from the reserve quota shall be resorted to. They should evolve a proper system of monitoring the fuel usage in their departments. Recourse to reserve quota should be taken only as a last resort.

6. Considering the increases in the prices of fuel and the need to enforce strict economy in the context of the present fuel crisis, it is essential that utmost care and vigilance is exercised in the utilization of vehicles and strict economy in fuel consumption is observed. Heads of Departments and Collectors are accordingly requested to issue firm instructions to their subordinates to restrict uneconomic trips by departmental vehicles and for restrained use of vehicles. On no account the operational ceiling fixed in columns (7) and (8) in the Annexure-I shall be exceeded by the departments. Heads of Departments are informed that no ratification for excess fuel consumption will be entertained. The cost of fuel consumed in excess of the operational ceiling fixed shall be recovered from the vehicle using officers concerned. This shall be enforced strictly. They are also requested to ensure that the fuel allotted is used for the sanctioned vehicles only. Otherwise, it will be viewed seriously.

7. Government have ordered in the G.O. second read above a special quota of fuel to the District Revenue Administration, Police and Civil Defence departments at the rates given in the annexure III to this order by keeping in view of the emergent Law and Order situations and also implementation of

Government schemes. The District Collectors, Commissioners of Police and Districts Superintendents of Police are requested to take special care that the above fuel ceiling should be utilized only during special drives towards implementing the schemes and while dealing with sensitive Law and Order situations.

8. The Government reiterates the earlier instructions that the expenditure on fuel consumption should be recorded under the detailed Head "45 - Petroleum, Oil and Lubricants". Departments of Secretariat / Heads of Departments are accordingly requested to ensure that the expenditure on fuel for motor vehicles is recorded only under the detailed Head "45 - Petroleum, Oil and Lubricants". Departments of Secretariat / Heads of departments are requested to surrender the funds if found excess with reference to sanctioned vehicles ordered by Government.

9. Pay and Accounts Officers / Treasury Officers are requested to ensure that the bills are settled based on the sanctioned G.O. of the vehicle and also verification of the vehicle number thus sanctioned by the Government. The bills for unsanctioned vehicles should not be honored.

10. Proposals for additional requirement of fuel for the vehicles not covered in this order and on purchase of new vehicles or surrender of fuel for vehicles found in excess of norms/ vehicles which are off the road for which fuel is not required this year, if any, should be sent by Departments of Secretariat / Heads of Departments directly to the Government in Finance Department by furnishing the actual sanctioned strength of the vehicles with government order and with registration numbers.
