ORDER:

In the reference read above orders have been issued sanctioning a sum of Rs.100.00 Crore for relief and rehabilitation measures for the heavy rain due to North-East Monsoon 2010.

2. As against the average 459 mm rainfall during the North-East Monsoon, this year, Tamil Nadu has already received rainfall of 615.9 mm so far during the North-East Monsoon. Heavy rains during the North-East Monsoon Session has affected the Coastal Areas, mainly, Cauveri Delta Districts during the last three weeks. The Coastal Districts of Cuddalore, Villupuram, Tiruvarur, Nagapattinam, Thanjavur, Pudukkottai, Ramanathapuram, Tirunelveli and Thoothukudi have been very badly affected by the heavy rains. 203 persons have lost their lives till date during the North-East Monsoon. A large number of huts have been damaged. Moreover, roads, bridges, culverts, tanks, ponds, public buildings and other structures have been severely damaged thereby dislocating the normal life. Crops in the coastal districts, mainly paddy, sugarcane and plantain have been very badly affected by the heavy rains causing severe distress among the farmers. The State administration has appointed senior I.A.S. officers as Monitoring Officers to visit the rain affected districts and monitor the flood relief works. The Monitoring Officers who visited the districts have reported heavy damage to the crops, water bodies, roads and public buildings. The State administration has directed the District administration to carry out flood relief works on war footing. The District Collectors have also assessed the total damage caused by the heavy rains during the North East Monsoon 2010. The following are the details of damages caused by heavy rains in the districts:

The extent of damage to the huts, houses and crops is being assessed as the flood water is yet to recede. This assessment will be finalized in a couple of days. However, the damage is expected to be very extensive as per the reports of the Collectors and Monitoring Officers.

3. The Government after careful examination of the Reports of the Collectors and Monitoring Officers accord sanction for an additional sum of Rs 100.00 Crore (Rupees One hundred Crore only) for relief assistance for the affected roads and Bridges Canals and other infrastructure and relief measures in flood affected areas to the different departments as follows:

Non-Plan - AD - Distribution of free supply of rice, cloth, food, kerosene, etc., in flood affected areas in Local Bodies - 24 - Materials and Supplies" (DPC 2245 02 191 AA 2400)

5. Necessary funds will be provided in RE/FMA 2010-2011. This item of expenditure shall be brought to the notice of the Legislative by specific inclusion in Final Supplementary Estimates for 2010-2011. Pending provision of such funds in RE/FMA 2010-2011, the Principal Secretary/Commissioner of Revenue Administration is permitted to draw and disburse the amount sanctioned in paragraph 3 above, as per the existing procedure, to the respective District Collectors and send the utilization certificate to the Accountant General/ Government and also include this item of expenditure shall be included while sending the proposal for RE/FMA 2010-2011 without fail.

6. The Principal Secretary / Commissioner of Revenue Administration may be authorized to allocate the reserve funds for payment of input subsidy to the affected farmers as per State Disaster Response Fund Norms, after the assessment is completed by the District Collectors. The District Collectors and Principal Secretary / Commissioner of Revenue Administration are requested to commence the works

7. The Principal Secretary / Commissioner of Revenue Administration shall furnish the details of amount incurred under each head of account mentioned above well in advance so as to include in RE/FMA 2010-2011.

8. The District Collectors concerned shall send a daily report to the Principal Secretary / Commissioner of Revenue Administration in the list of works sanctioned by them department-wise.

9. This orders issues with the concurrence of Finance Department vide its U.O.No 3227/FS/P/Revenue/2010, dated: 8.12.2010 and A.S.L.No.1504 (one thousand five hundred and four)
