## ORDER

The infrastructure and basic amenities in Urban Local Bodies in Tamil Nadu need to be improved. Particularly, the Chennai City needs extensive improvements in respect of basic amenities.

2. In this connection, in the Budget Speech for 2011-12, the following Announcement has been made:-

"With the completion of the World Bank assisted TNUDP –III, the funding available for the improvement of infrastructure and basic amenities in Urban Local Bodies has shrunk further. This Government will launch two special programmes – The Chennai Mega City Development Mission for Chennai and its suburban areas and the Integrated Urban Development Mission for all other Corporations,

Municipalities and Town Panchayats to supplement the available funds under various schemes. A sum of Rs.500 crore has been provided for the Chennai Mega City Development Mission and Rs.750 crore for the Integrated Urban Development Mission in the revised Budget Estimates. Under these missions, existing schemes will be dovetailed to improve the standards of basic infrastructure like roads and streets, drinking water, sewerage and sanitation, storm water drains, Solid Waste Management, Improvement of Bus Stands and parking places etc., in an integrated manner. I expect that the additional resources provided under Chennai Mega City Development Mission and Integrated Urban Development Mission will give a fillip to the development of basic amenities in urban areas”.

3. Consequent on the above announcements, the Chairperson and Managing Director, Tamil Nadu Urban Infrastructure Financial Services Ltd was requested in the Government Letter first read above to draw the detailed components of the Chennai Mega City Development Mission in consultation with the Commissioner, Corporation of Chennai, the Managing Director, Chennai Metro Water Supply and Sewerage Board and then take follow up action for preparation of Detailed Project Reports for the mission and also the funding options for implementation of the Mission.

4. Accordingly, the Chairperson and Managing Director, Tamil Nadu Urban Infrastructure Financial Services Ltd called for a detailed presentation of the schemes to be taken up under the Chennai Mega City Development Mission, from the Commissioner, Corporation of Chennai and the Managing Director, Chennai Metro Water Supply and Sewerage Board and accordingly schemes have been identified for a tentative cost of Rs.25,552 Crore to be implemented in the next five years. The Chairperson and Managing Director, Tamil Nadu Urban Infrastructure Financial Services Ltd then called upon the Commissioner of Chennai Corporation and the Managing Director, Chennai Metro Water Supply and Sewerage Board to prepare the Detailed Project Reports for the schemes and prioritise the works for execution from the year 2011-12 to 2015-16 and come up with the possible funding options for appraisal.

5. In the circumstances stated in Para 4 above, the Government direct that the Commissioner, Corporation of Chennai and the Managing Director, Chennai Metro Water Supply and Sewarage Board to prepare the Detailed Project Reports for the Schemes proposed by them and prioritise the schemes for implementation from the year 2011-12 to 2015-2016 with the possible funding options in consultation with the Chairperson, Tamil Nadu Urban Infrastructure Financial Services Ltd and send the proposals to Government for issue of Administrative Sanction before 31.10.2011. In respect of the schemes proposed under the State Budget announced for Rs.500 Crore (Rupees Five Hundred Crore Only) for the year 2011-2012, a separate proposal may be drawn up from culling out from the schemes suggested in Chennai Mega City Development Mission and sent to Government through the Chairperson and Managing Director, Tamil Nadu Urban Infrastructure Financial Services Ltd before 15.11.2011 for administrative sanction.
