ORDER :

The National Rural Health Mission (NRHM) has been launched in Tamil Nadu to improve the Health status of the people, especially those who live in the villages. Government of India has given instructions that the urban areas having less than one lakh population where there are no health services or poor health services may be brought under the purview of the National Rural Health Mission. Out of 135 such municipalities in Tamil Nadu, 60 Municipalities with around 50,000 population, have been identified for introduction of the Urban Health Programme under Reproductive and Child Health II for the year 2009-10.

2. The Mission Director in her letter 2nd read, above, has proposed to provide uniform basic infrastructure and staff for Urban Health Centres similar to rural Primary Health Centre pattern. The minimal requirement for Urban Health Centre is one Medical Officer, four ANM, one pharmacist, one Lab Technician and two Hospital workers. The existing gap in terms of manpower and infrastructure based on the staff pattern were identified by Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine and Director of Municipal Administration. Accordingly, the Mission Director has proposed to provide 57 Medical Officers, 60 Pharmacists, 60 Lab Technicians, 111 ANMs and 120 Hospital Workers to the 60 Urban Health Centers to be filled up on contract basis. The Mission Director, State Health Society proposed to make payment to the Medical Officer

in the time scale of pay from the State Government funds and National Rural Health Mission will remit the Budgeted / Approved amount of Government of India towards salary into the State Government account as in the case of Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan.

3. The Mission Director has also proposed to form Patient Welfare Society in each of the proposed Urban Health Centre similar to Primary Health Centre and Rs.1 lakh per annum to be given as maintenance grant and also an untied fund of Rs.25,000 per annum to be given to each Urban Health Centre to meet out the expenditure towards the essential and emergency requirements. The rules and by laws for the establishment and functioning of Patient Welfare Society in the Primary Health Centre framed in the Government Order first read above to be applicable to the Patient Welfare Society of Urban Health Centres also. The composition for governing body, executive committee and monitoring committee of the Patient Welfare Society in the Urban Health Centres has also been suggested by the Mission Director. The Mission Director has stated that the cost proposed for these activities as approved by NPCC is Rs.75 lakhs, she has proposed that the balance amount out of Rs.800.16 lakhs allocated for Urban Health Centres to be utilized for the provisions of infrastructure strengthening like rent, repair, equipments, electricity charges etc., which will be released by the Mission Director, State Health Society based on the NPCC / Executive Committee approval.

4. The Mission Director also proposed to extend the scheme to 11 more Municipalities as requested by some district collectors during the teleconference on DHA plan for district specific schemes. The Mission Director has requested the Government to take a decision about entrusting the management of the Urban Health Centres. The Mission Director has stated that the proposal has been approved by the 8th Executive Committee Meeting held on 10.06.2009. The Mission Director has requested the Government to accord permission for strengthening the Health care in 60 Municipalities identified by the Director of Municipal Administration by setting up Urban Health Centres and also to strengthen Health care in 11 Municipalities requested by the District Collectors in the same manner.

5. The Government after careful examination, accord permission to the Mission Director, State Health Society to set up Urban Health Centres only in 60 Municipalities in the first phase identified by the Director of Municipal Administration given in the Annexure I to this Government Order. The following orders are issued in this regard.

- i) The Mission Director, State Health Society / Director of Municipal Administration is permitted to strengthen the Urban Health Centres in the 60 Municipalities with appointment of 57 Medical officers, 60 Pharmacists, 60 Lab Technicians, 111 ANMs and 120 Hospital Workers in the 60 Urban Health Centres in the Municipalities on the same lines as approved for the 110 new Primary Health Centres in regular pay scale for the doctors and on consolidated pay for other categories.
- ii) These Urban Health Centres shall be maintained by the respective Urban Local Bodies and they will be under the administrative control of Municipal Administration Department. All additional staff to be posted to those

Urban Health Centres shall be filled up by the Director of Municipal Administration. The salary of the staff shall be paid only through the Urban Local Body and not by the Government. After the National Rural Health Mission project is over, the expenditure of the Urban Health Centre shall be shared by the State Government and the Urban Local Body in the 50 : 50 ratio.

- iii) The Mission Director, State Health Society, in consultation with the Director of Municipal Administration and the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine shall form a institutionalised co-ordination structure for efficient functioning of these centres to ensure the better health care to the urban public.
- iv) The Mission Director, State Health Society is permitted to establish Patient Welfare Societies in the 60 Urban Health Centres on the pattern followed for the Primary Health Centres and to release funds to the society as indicated in para 3 above.
- v) The Mission Director, is permitted to incur the expenditure for these Urban Health Centres from the National Rural Health Mission funds.

6. This order issues with concurrence of the Finance Department vide its U.O. No.534 / SS / PK / 2009, dated : 25.02.2010.
